Dear Families,

Religious Education is at the centre of both the formal and informal Saint Monica's school curriculum. Saint Monica's is characterised by a high proportion of Catholic teachers and students, with visible Catholic symbolic culture and active sacramental and liturgical practices. The values, ideals and challenges of the Gospel, embodied in the person of Jesus Christ, find explicit expression in the Religious education curriculum and the way we do things at Saint Monica's. Part of who we are is modelled in how we interact with each other and how we support each other.

It is often said that at Saint Monica's there is a certain feel to the school and the way we are community, and that feeling is a main reason why people choose to become part of the Saint Monica's family. This tangible presence or way of being is, us a community living out the compassionate ministry of Jesus Christ. This way of being is encapsulated in the Catholic Social Teachings, or CST for short.

On Monday all the staff at Saint Monica's were invited to Melbourne to further our understanding of CST. We had the privilege of spending the day with Sister Geraldine Larkin the Deputy Director for the Sandhurst Catholic Education Office who also lectures at Australian Catholic University on CST. At Saint Monica's our explicit teaching of Catholic Social Teachings states 6 principles upon which we base our lives. These principles cover all spheres of life - the economic, political, personal and spiritual.

The 6 Catholic Social Teachings are

- Dignity of the Human Person
- The Common Good
- Preferential Option for the Poor
- Solidarity
- Subsidiarity & Participation
- Stewardship of Creation

Over the remainder of the Year I will be expanding upon each of these CST in the newsletter. I will discuss what they each mean, how they can be found in our everyday and how we can integrate them further into our daily lives.

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

In order to prepare for the language & learning demands of the school environment, children need ample time and opportunity to engage meaningful interactions with their family.

Research suggests that the types of questions we ask and the quality of discussions we have with our children, from a very young age, are linked to school success. As children progress through the grades they must learn to use extended discourse in telling stories, giving

explanations, reporting, expressing an opinion or writing an essay. Asking children "if, why and how"

type questions allows them to deepen their thinking and prepare longer and more complex responses. It makes sense to build their confidence with extended discourse gradually, beginning with simple oral tasks.

In each weekly newsletter this year, our school's Speech Pathologist will provide some "family friendly", fun oral language tasks aimed to enhance learning and literacy skills.

We encourage you to set some time aside each week so that you can get the most out of your interactions with your child.

In a busy household, sometimes the car is the best place for these focused activities. The key

ingredients for a creative interaction are a time, a place, a willing talking partner or audience and an engaging topic or activity.

If your child is reading a particular book at home or in class, try to incorporate words or ideas from that text into your activity. For example; if you are building your child's use of describing words, select a character from your child's reader to describe. Encourage increasingly expensive words such as the *beautiful, gorgeous, stunning and breath-taking* princess. Positive communication experiences at home help children feel accepted and valued. Growth in spoken language skills will build children's self-confidence and help them learn to negotiate social interactions at school. This often transfers to other aspects of their learning and life.



Ten activities will be provided each term focusing on key areas of oral language supporting literacy, learning and socialising. Feel free to adjust these activities according to your child's grade level.

Vocabulary/Morphology activities:

3. Guess what's inside the bag: Fill a range of items in a cloth or any opaque bag. The children (and adults) are required to feel one of the items and describe it (in relation to its texture, size and shape) before trying to guess what the item may be. Encourage them to use interesting and different words rather than the usual - big, hard, square (considerably large, tough, four-sided figure). This game could be played at home, in the classroom, in the car etc. as long as nobody takes a sneak peek in the bag.

4. Reading: When reading a text with your child, discuss words that have tricky meanings i.e. words you don't hear or see very often. Develop a weekly list of tricky words e.g. exhilarated, frantic, ogre, pessimistic, ambled. Encourage your child to draw a picture of each word or find a picture of the word on google images. Get them to use the word after watching a TV program each day. For example, I was so exhilarated after watching my favourite show I couldn't wipe the smile of my face.

Morphology: Morphological awareness is a skill that helps students read and spell. It involves breaking up words into their root word, prefixes, and suffixes. These can be added or taken away from a word to alter its meaning. For example, the word unhelpful can be broken into: a prefix - un (meaning not), root word - help, and a suffix - ful (meaning full of). This could be explained as: not full of help. The following activities will help develop your child's morphological awareness and improve indirectly their fluency, reading comprehension, and spelling.



MERCY IN ACTION

What is it?

A few years ago at a P&F meeting, it was suggested that as a school community we may be able to assist families within our school in times of need, sadness and happiness, i.e. illness, death in the family, birth of a baby etc. It was decided that a simple way we could achieve this was to provide basic food items for families at these times. So Mercy In Action was established, it continues today as an extremely positive and successful program – a way to show we care for and support each other here at St. Monica's School.

How does it work?

Families are asked to become part of the program by offering to donate a food item to be stored in our freezer, ready to be given when a need arises. Food items need only be basic, just like what you would have at home with your family.

How can you help?

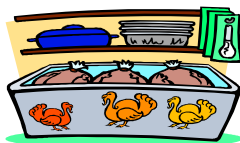

HEAD LICE FACTS: (The things you're not being told!)

Head lice treatment do not kill eggs!

WHICH MEANS:

Remaining eggs will still hatch after treatment occurs.

Lice from hatched eggs can mature enough in 7 days to lay eggs. To avoid this happening treat again in 6 days (not 7 as treatments indicate!)

Eggs can take up to 10 days to hatch! WHICH MEANS: Eggs are still hatching after second treatment. You need to treat the child's hair till they are clear, not by the label!

Conditioner/comb method is very effective (especially when used with a "KP24" comb) Even if you are not using this method to treat it is handy to use it on all members of the family to establish who needs to be treated before tackling the Head lice "cycle"

PLEASE CHECK YOUR CHILDS HAIR AS THE SCHOOL HAS HAD A REPORTED CASE OF HEAD LICE.

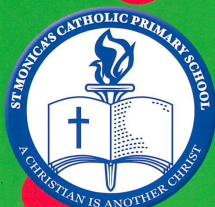

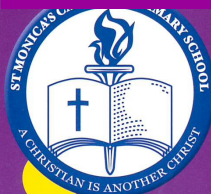

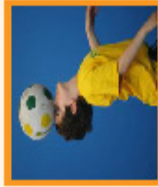
